# THE MILITANT YOUTH MOVEMENT IN THE PHILIPPINES



Protesting students: Exposing U.S.'s role



The militant youth movement ANAKBAYAN—an acronym for Sons and Daughters of the People—played a leading role in the “People’s Power II” uprising which ousted corrupt former Philippine President Joseph Estrada.

ANAKBAYAN has also struggled against the violent repression of peasant activists, oil price hikes, higher tuition, the Manila government’s war against the Moro people in Mindanao—often in the face of violent repression themselves. On April 15, a policeman killed Ramon “Bong” Ternida, 20, chairperson of Anakbayan and Bayan Muna coordinator in Mindoro Oriental.
